



## Volunteer Script/Voter Screening Questions

“Thank you so much for coming today!”

- 1) “Are you here to sign the petition to repeal the radical k-12 sex ed bill?”  
If “yes”, continue.  
If “no”, hand them “Senate Bill 5395 Info Points” to read (be sure to get it back when they are finished and sterilize plastic sheet protector).
- 2) “Are you registered to vote in the state of Washington?”  
If “yes”, continue.  
If “no”, ask them to go to [voter.voterwa.gov](http://voter.voterwa.gov) to register, then return when that is complete.
- 3) “Is your voter information up-to-date? Current name & address?”  
If “yes”, continue.  
If “no”, ask them to go to [voter.voterwa.gov](http://voter.voterwa.gov) to check or to update their information, then return when that is complete.
- 4) “Voters must use the signature and address associated with their voter registration. **Every individual signing the petition MUST fill in ALL the fields.**” (Point out each field and then hand the clipboard to the individual.)
- 5) “How did you hear about this event?” (Add info to media tracker.)

\*Retrieve the clipboard and **check that ALL the fields were filled in before they drive away!**

\*Sterilize clipboard before proceeding to the next car.

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## Senate Bill 5395 Info Points

- » SB 5395 requires that all Washington state public schools provide comprehensive sexuality education in grades k-12, using curriculum approved by the Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI).
- » Comprehensive sexuality education (CSE) and SB 5395 are endorsed by Planned Parenthood.
- » Comprehensive sexuality education is defined in Planned Parenthood's CSE framework as "an emphasis on sexual expression, sexual fulfillment and pleasure."
- » Under SB 5395, school districts are not provided any funding or training to implement CSE.
- » Under SB 5395, school districts must choose or develop comprehensive sexuality education curriculum which is approved by OSPI.
- » The only CSE curriculum currently approved by OSPI for K-3 lessons is called "Rights, Respect and Responsibility", or the 3Rs. It is written by Advocates for Youth, which openly embraces youth sexuality as normal and healthy.
- » Although parents/guardians can opt their children out of CSE lessons by filing a written request, it does not take into account that CSE changes the nature of school social environments. Students opting out will likely be teased or bullied for not participating, and students receiving the lessons will talk in class and on the playground about what they learn. Therefore, opting out will not ultimately shield children from the CSE information or its wide-sweeping social impact.
- » Referendum 90 will repeal SB 5395.
